

Mayflower High School Pupil Premium Expenditure Report 2012-2013

Overview of Pupil Premium

The Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 and is allocated to schools to work with pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last six years (known as 'Ever 6 FSM').

Schools also receive funding for children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months, and children of service personnel.

It is for schools to decide how the Pupil Premium is spent, since they are best placed to assess what additional provision should be made for the individual pupils within their responsibility.

The funding was £623 in 2012-13.

Summary of PPG spending 2012/13

Objectives in spending PPG:

- 1. To enhance student learning, attendance, behaviour and well being in order to improve progress for identified students
- 2. To support students to help narrow and close the attainment gap that exists between pupils from disadvantaged backgrounds and more affluent backgrounds
- 3. To address underlying inequalities between students who are eligible for the pupil premium and others
- 4. To promote the engagement and enjoyment of learning inside and outside of the classroom

Summary of spending and actions taken:

Tracking and monitoring developed within SIMs and 4 Matrix for FSM/ Ever 6 students.

Staff awareness increased on strategies to raise achievement and to 'narrow the gap' at all levels (including reference to the Sutton Toolkit).

Governors involved in spending allocation, review of intervention and development of future priorities.

Student progress meetings held and intervention put in place for all year groups.

Appointment of Pupil Premium Co-ordinator April 2013.

Intervention strategies reviewed and further developed.

Focus on Literacy and Numeracy tracking and intervention (including one to one tuition, resources, breakfast club and registration programmes).



Support for individuals to enhance attendance, behaviour and progress.

Student Voice to assess the areas of need.

Funding on a range of areas to increase engagement and enjoyment of learning.

Summer School August 2013 involved current Year 7 and Year 6 students.

Meetings held with pastoral teams to review actions and further enhance interventions for students in each year group

Outcomes to date:

All Pupil Premium students effectively identified and tracked via SIMS and 4Matrix analysis

Appropriate intervention strategies to narrow the gap in student progress and attainment initiated including 1:1 tuition, literacy and numeracy support, resources and Teacher Learning Community used to improve AfL for all

1:1 in 2011-12 was limited to KS3 students and this has been extended to include KS4 Pupil Premium students

In 2011-12 some Pupil Premium students accepted 1:1 tuition in English and/or Maths. This has increased significantly in 2012-13.

In 2012-2013, the percentage attendance for all students is above the national average. There is a slight gap between the cohort and the pupil premium smaller cohorts within each year. All attendance is carefully monitored and tracked and intervention is put in place involving both students and parents.

All pupil premium students have been effectively monitored and intervention put in place at a range of scales including the class teacher, subject leaders, SENCO, pastoral leaders and the pupil premium coordinator.
